

# Subsidised tuition for your school

with the National Tutoring Programme

The National Tutoring programme (NTP) is a fund that schools can use specifically for tuition, helping to deliver targeted support for students who are from disadvantaged backgrounds and whose learning was impacted by the pandemic. This year, schools can use this fund to subsidise tuition by up to **60%**.

If you're finding it tricky to get the most out of your funding, don't worry - we're on hand to help you get the maximum impact from your NTP grant this academic year.

## The 22/23 NTP at a glance:

- £349 million total grant available to UK schools
- You can use NTP funds to get a 60% subsidy per lesson
- Available for KS1-4 (years 1-11)
- The NTP recommends 12-15 hours of small group (3:1) tuition to maximise impact
- You'll need to spend the money with approved Tuition Partners

## What mainstream schools get (per student):

The NTP grant is a minimum of £162 per Pupil Premium student, to be used to subsidise up to £10.80 per lesson - or, in other words, **60% of an £18 lesson**. Non-mainstream schools are eligible for a higher amount per student.

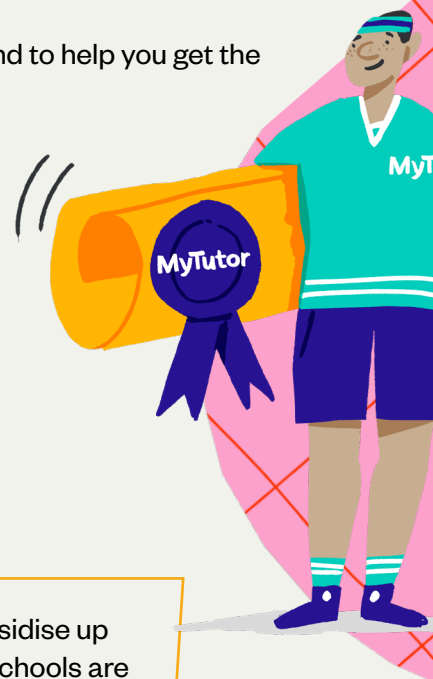
Your school's NTP funding is based on your number of Pupil Premium students, who you are encouraged to support with the programme. But ultimately, the decision is down to you - you're able to use the fund to support students you think would benefit most.

## Here's an example of how it works:

You're a mainstream school with a funding allocation of £5,200. By the end of the academic year, you've provided 480 hours of tutoring to your students, through an approved Tuition Partner (like MyTutor). It cost you £8,400 in total.

That means your hourly rate for tuition was £17.50 - within the maximum of £18-per-hour that can be subsidised by the NTP. The NTP will subsidise 60% of your total cost - in this case, that's £5,040.

Because your total allocation was £5,200, your school has left £160 of your funding unspent.



## When you'll receive the funding

One third of your total NTP grant will be sent to you each term, so you can spread tuition support consistently through the year.

## How to work with approved tuition partners (like us!)

The NTP grant has to be spent on Tuition Partners that have gone through a quality assurance process from the Department for Education. You can find a full list of approved Tuition Partners on the government website, through the 'Find a Tuition Partner' service.
